HISTORY OF TOPIC

BEGINNINGS

The Invincible universe is just like any other, except here, the Earth is riddled with individuals holding great powers. Superheroes emerged worldwide in the 20th century, largely due to scientific and technological advancements resulting from government-led experiments, as well as mutations, alien powers, and a variety of other factors. In the beginnings of superheroism, an extraterrestrial being by the name of Omni-Man came to Earth from the alien Viltrumite Empire and declared that he was there to protect the planet and people of Earth. He was immediately received with overwhelming love from most civilians and admiration as he defended the citizens of Earth from everything ranging from sea monsters to bank

robbers. Superheroes, including Omni-Man, fight valiantly to fend off dangerous alien invasions, rebuild decimated landscapes after disasters, and develop cutting-edge technology. But where there is good, there is also evil. Supervillains, and also, not-so-super villains, loot, steal, and take over governments, whether that be with man-power, weapons, or enhanced abilities.

To support a fight against these forces, heroes all over the world join groups, some government-sanctioned, to solve a variety of issues threatening the safety of humanity. In the United States, the government established the Global Defense Agency, or GDA, in the mid-20th century after Omni-Man arrived to preserve national security by collaborating with superheroes and scientists to develop advanced technology and protect its citizens.

The GDA created the Guardians of the Globe- a team of superheroes on call to respond to international emergencies, made up of seven heroes: Green Ghost, Red Rush, Martian Man, Aquarius, Darkwing, War Woman, and The Immortal. They primarily deal in larger-scale global threats, leaving petty crime to be handled by others. The GDA wanted Omni-Man to join the Guardians of the Globe, but he refused to join, wanting to preserve his freedom to choose his own battles.

Omni-Man possesses a multitude of powers, so much so that he's the most powerful man on Earth, no questions asked. But to the outside world, he's Nolan Grayson, a normal middle-aged man and husband of Debbie Grayson, a real estate agent. The two have a son, Mark Grayson, who is in high school. Nolan did not know if Mark would inherit his Viltrumite powers, but they abruptly appeared one day when eighteen-year-old Mark realized he was a lot stronger than usual, accidentally flinging a garbage bag into outer space. Thus, Nolan began to teach his son about his newfound powers and where they came from- the Viltrumite Empire. Mark idolized his father and worked hard every day in their training sessions, but also practiced in secret to



become a vigilante against his father's wishes, as Nolan wanted Mark to lead a normal life as a high-schooler.

Vigilante Mark Grayson, unaffiliated with any law enforcement agency, began with street-level crimes after choosing the name "Invincible" for himself. He had run-ins with the Teen Team, a group of teenage superheroes whom he would help out or call on for assistance from time to time. The Teen Team's primary objective was to handle smaller threats before they joined larger, more dangerous superhero organizations. It was composed of Robot, the team leader, Atom Eve, Rex Splode, Dupli-Kate, and Shrinking-Rae. Through seeing each other at school every day and occasionally fighting evil together, Mark and Eve became friends, and later, Eve became the first outsider to learn Mark's true identity. Mark would then go on to officially fight crime, leaving the shadows of his hiding, and slowly started working with the GDA, after being called upon by its president, Cecil Stedman. But as Mark gained more control over his abilities, his desire to learn about his heritage on his father's side only grew stronger, directing his attention to the Viltrumite Empire.

THE VILTRUMITE EMPIRE

The planet Viltrum, home to aliens called Viltrumites, is the heart of the Viltrumite Empire. They share very similar DNA to humans, and although they outwardly appear to be the same, Viltrumites lack what some may consider the most human trait of all- they do not feel empathy.

The Viltrumites are not a peaceful alien race. They were warriors who killed each other until the strongest remained. They decided that their ways were superior to those of other alien races, and they sent acclaimed warriors to each planet in the galaxy to conquer and annex their fallen planet to the Viltrumite Empire. For the most part, this strategy worked. The Viltrumites took over and wiped out entire civilizations of creatures when they did not comply with Viltrumite rule. They were a formidable threat to many, and this led to the establishment of the Coalition of Planets, which is made up of multiple alien civilizations forming an interstellar alliance. The Coalition of Planets was formed specifically in retaliation of the Viltrumite reign of terror and is a diplomatic organization that acts as a galactic defense against large-scale threats, sharing

intelligence amongst its planet members. Thus, planets were wary of a Viltrumite invasion.

Though, unbeknownst to almost everyone, there was a Viltrumite on Earth. The strongest man on Earth. Omni-Man.

OMNI MAN'S WEB OF LIES

When it was discovered that Guardians of the Globe were massacred at their headquarters, pandemonium broke out. Someone with extreme power had to have killed them, as the Guardians were amongst the strongest of the global superheroes. The GDA was on the case, along with Damien Darkblood, a demon detective who wants to leave Hell, and the only way he can is to help humans on Earth.

Cecil Stedman had a hunch. He knew it had to be none other than Nolan Grayson, or Omni-Man. Stedman, a mastermind, deduced this fact from the total slaughter of the Guardians- only Omni-Man possessed the strength to do it. But the only thing Cecil couldn't figure out was the motive.

Omni-Man wasn't like the rest, as most Viltrumites immediately conquer their assigned planet, while he instead spent 20 years helping Earth and building a family. Nolan Grayson lied to his wife and son, and when Mark Grayson received his powers, Nolan began to train him. Nolan lied about the truth of who the Viltrumites were, saying that he is there to protect Earth, and hid the fact that he killed the Guardians of the Globe. He hid his suit, stained with the blood of the members of the Guardians of the Globe, and asked Art Rosenbaum, a tailor for all superhero suits, for a new one. Nolan's wife eventually found his stained suit, and through sleuthing with Art's help, Debbie Grayson and Art figured out that Nolan killed the Guardians. This information shocked her to her core. She saw her reality crumble because the man she had known and loved for 20 years was a mask for a liar and a murderer.

Cecil Stedman knew about Nolan's betrayal, but he couldn't find a way to prove it until Damien had cracked

the case with evidence. Instead of freeing him, Cecil banishes him to Hell for fear of creating mass hysteria if the world found out that Omni-Man had murdered their greatest superheroes.

Three people on Earth knew without a doubt that Nolan was guilty. When Nolan knew his lies were catching up to him, he knew he had to reach Mark first, before anyone could tell him the truth.

INVINCIBLE VS OMNI-MAN

Mark Grayson, raised as half-human, half-Viltrumite, was never told of the true ways of his father's people. He had recently been dumped by his now ex-girlfriend Amber Bennett, and was living his life as normal as he could, oblivious to what was coming. Omni-Man wanted to be the first to tell Mark because he knew that the lie was about to be revealed, but he hoped that Mark was exactly as he had trained him to be- not a human, but a future Viltrumite- an emotionless soldier for the Empire.

The GDA raced against Omni-Man to find Invincible and be the one to tell him the truth about his father, but they were no match for Nolan, who discovered Mark first in rural Chicago with Eve. Eve senses that Nolan needs to have a private word with his son, and she excuses herself before Omni-Man takes Mark and flies up into the sky, explaining the truth of the Viltrumite Empire and his reasons for being on Earth.

Surprisingly to Nolan, Mark was both devastated and enraged by his father's confession of his heritage and true reason for being on Earth. His father wasn't there to help anyone. He was there to take over the planet for the Viltrumite Empire. The mixture of immense shock and betrayal produced an immense rage within Mark, culminating in a physical, super-powered battle between father and son.

Mark had no idea of the true extent of his abilities, but his emotional thinking led him to use what he could of his Viltrumite powers. The battle began in the rural areas of Illinois, with Nolan predictably throwing

most of the punches, trying to convince Mark that the Viltrumite way was the only way- the correct way. He talked of the inadequacy of humanity, citing the uselessness of empathy. Scorning humans' short life styles and corrupt political environments, Nolan attempted to persuade Mark that Viltrumite rule could help. However, Mark now knew that this "help" meant completely controlling the planet and killing those who resisted.

Enraged, Mark asked Nolan what the past 20 years of his life meant, what his family meant. Unfazed, Nolan remarked that he saw his wife Debbie as nothing more than a pet. Onlookers to this battle, the world watched as Mark stood firm, telling his father that he would never join the Viltrumite Empire and that he would fight for humanity himself.

And so they fought, flying over the city of Chicago, their punches broadcast on news channels for the world to see. Their battle was destructive and tore up the civilian infrastructure. Omni-Man's unmatched



strength decimated buildings, tore up streets, and leveled apartments. In the end, Omni-Man beat his own son to the brink of death and left Earth. Mark was taken to the hospital, where he miraculously recovered with the GDA's advanced medical technology.

CURRENT SITUATION

The world is shaken up with the aftermath of the fight. Nowadays, Mark is grappling with the fact that his father lied to him his entire life. He wants to use his powers for good and save the world, despite his father's intentions. However, he also wants to lead a normal life by going to college and having adventures with his closest friends, Will and Eve. Mark knows he's supposed to be this great hero, and intends to figure out what his path forward is.

The rest of humanity, heroes and villains, are now coming together to help rebuild Chicago. The destruction of the city has displaced millions of people, overflowing homeless shelters. Omni-Man flew into buildings, scrambled sidewalks, and leveled skyscrapers. Not only were homes lost, but people's places of work were too. Many people are temporarily out of a job. The streets are flooded, and children go without food and shelter. The cold of Chicago is leaving people with pneumonia and more illnesses; hospitals cannot keep up. Chicago does not have enough resources to rebuild on its own. They need help from people, the government, and superheroes.

Above all that, crime still runs rampant. Criminals have taken this opportunity to loot and steal what is left. Banks have been robbed, food has been stolen, and what's left of stores and malls is gone. Then, some use their powers for evil. Villains have taken control of what is left of Chicago. These villains are not only from Earth, but also, at times, alien races that like to invade Earth for resources. Although this does not occur often, it is still

a threat to look out for and safeguard against.

Omni-Man's absence must also be taken into consideration. A Viltrumite leaving his post is unheard of, and the Viltrumite Empire will be hunting down Omni-Man. Since he fled Earth, Omni-Man will now be hiding in the last corners of the universe to avoid the wrath of his people. However, once the Viltrumites find Omni-Man, Earth is the next target, because Omni-Man failed to conquer it, showing the rest of the universe that the Viltrumite Empire might be weak and willing to let a civilization go. The Viltrumites will do anything to remain in control of the universe, and Earth will not be a failure.

And thus, you are Earth's last remaining hope. Mark has called his closest advisors and fellow superhero friends to band together and create a committee to help determine a plan of action in the wake of Omni-Man's carnage. You must remain vigilant in what is to come, whether that be villain attacks, alien invasion, or the Viltrumite Empire's impending emergence to conquer Earth. The public wants to be protected and safe, and Mark wants Chicago to rebuild and Earth to remain secure in the future. You must learn to be... Invincible.

- What are the possible limitations that might be in place when doing a reconstruction to this magnitude?
- What international or intergalactic allies might we have that can be of use in this situation, and in the future? How will you solve the problem of alien invasions on a global scale?
- Should we think ahead to what might happen when the Viltrumites realize Omni-Man has left his post?

CHARACTER DOSSIER




ATOM EVE




ALLEN THE ALIEN



Robot, former leader of Teen Team and member of the new Guardians of the Globe, is an artificial intelligence weapon determined to work for the greater good. Donald Ferguson is Cecil Stedman's assistant, an agent of the Global Defense Agency, and a contact for the new Guardians of the Globe. Donald has frequently been put in the line of fire, but has little to no memory of these events and comes back without a scratch from missions that should have landed him in a hospital. He continues to work as a high-ranking member of the GDA because, despite being human, he wants to help people in any way he can. He is known as Cecil's assistant, but has a rebellious streak, often helping superheroes and family with personal issues. Donald is selfless, brave, and intelligent, with his quick thinking a great tool when helping debrief Cecil on missions and situations. He wants to learn more about his seemingly untouchable body and the past choices that have led him to the man he is today. By working alongside Cecil and the GDA, he wants to rebuild Chicago and protect it from future threats.



Will Clockwell, best friend of Mark Grayson, is supportive yet sarcastic. He cares greatly about Mark and is astonished when he finds out Mark is Invincible. Will is not afraid of telling the truth when it matters and is steadfast in his will to do what is right. Will also wants to be there for his best friend, Mark, when he needs him as they graduate from high school and move through life. However, something feels off for Will. He is slowly realizing that as he grows older, his body is changing. He's always wanted to be a nurse, but he is finding out that he can mysteriously heal injuries. While interning at a Chicago Hospital, he finds that the little boy with the fractured arm is miraculously healed after Will saw him. The soccer player with the torn Achilles is already walking without a limp. Will wants to seek help from Mark and the Global Defense Agency to see if these are possibly new superhealing powers. Will hopes he can use his powers to help those who were injured in the destruction of Chicago.

Olga, born in Moscow, Russia, was the wife of the late Red Rush, who was a member of the original Guardians of the Globe and a victim of Omni-Man's massacre. Olga is a tough woman who loved her deceased husband, but she wishes he had slowed down to spend time with her. She worked internationally for the management of a marketing firm, and continuously received promotions due to her phenomenal leadership skills. Olga is picking up the pieces of her life after her husband's death. She must figure out what her next steps are, whether that is going back to Russia or staying in Chicago. Olga has deep roots in Russia, especially in the superhero community there. Her marriage to Red Rush gave her connections to the Global Defense Agency's branch in Russia. Olga wants to help rebuild Chicago in some way, specifically with her leadership skills and allies in Russia's superhero community.



Rex Sloan is the powerful superhero Rex Splode, with the ability to generate explosive energy. Rex is argumentative and reckless, which often backfires on him. He cheated on his ex-girlfriend Eve with Dupli-Kate and finds himself in risky situations. He's learning to be a better team player, but he does want most of the glory for himself. By playing the devil's advocate, he has somehow gained the trust of Cecil Stedman and the Global Defense Agency. With Chicago in shambles, this is his big break into being its greatest savior, and he intends to take on a more defensive role in rebuilding Chicago, as his powers are better suited to defending against evil.
